In 2026, the McLamb Family Reunion returns to Sampson County, North Carolina—where our roots remain deeply planted.



The venue is owned by a McLamb cousin; his mother was Gatsie Ruth McLamb (Rich), daughter of Isham McLamb and granddaughter of Minnie McLamb.
